<http://news.bbc.co.uk/> is a multilingual news website. Using Netscape or Internet Explorer, enter the URL for this website then select the appropriate language as outlined below. The language selection button is half way down the left side of the news page – scroll down until you see it. Make your selection according to the following rules:

- First language is English**, please select the English version.
- First language is Chinese**, please select the Chinese version.
- First language is neither English nor Chinese**, please select English version.
